Alice Ramos holds a PhD in Sociology, University of Lisbon. She is a research fellow at Instituto de Ciências Sociais da Universidade de Lisboa (Portugal) and coordinator of the ICS-ULisboa Summer/Winter Schools.

She is National Program Director of EVS in Portugal and vice-chair of the Methodology Group of EVS.

Alice is also National Coordinator of the European Social Survey-ERIC and Representative of Portugal in the SUSTAIN Project, which also includes a work package aimed at exploring closer collaboration between EVS and ESS.

She participate in the ISSP from 1997 to 2014.

Additionally, she coordinates the line of Data Production of the infrastructure PASSDA (Production and Archive of Social Science Data) and is Principal Investigator of CLAVE, a project studying the development of values on children and early adolescents and its relationships to personal well-being, discriminatory attitudes towards minority groups, and perceptions of social justice.. Her research interests include the articulation between individual and cultural values, and their interaction with racism, prejudice and discrimination, attitudes towards immigration and the methodology of cross-national studies, in particular about survey techniques, interviewer effects, questionnaire design and testing, and advanced methods of comparative and longitudinal data analysis. The results of her studies have been published, among others, on *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies*, *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and in several contributions to edited books.
